

FOR EARLY FRANK HEARING.

Supreme Court Asked to Set Time,
but Not Before Feb. 22.

WASHINGTON, Jan. 25.—Fulton Brylawski, of counsel of Leo M. Frank, under sentence of death for murder in Atlanta, today moved in the Supreme Court of the United States for the advancement of argument in Frank's appeal for a writ of habeas corpus. Mr. Brylawski said that after consultation with Warren Grice, Attorney General of Georgia, he had his approval in asking that the hearing be advanced to not earlier than Feb. 22, before which time Mr. Grice would be engaged in other courts.

The formal motion presented by Mr. Brylawski was signed by Louis Marshall, Henry C. Peeples, Henry A. Alexander, and Mr. Brylawski. The court will announce its action later probably Monday.
