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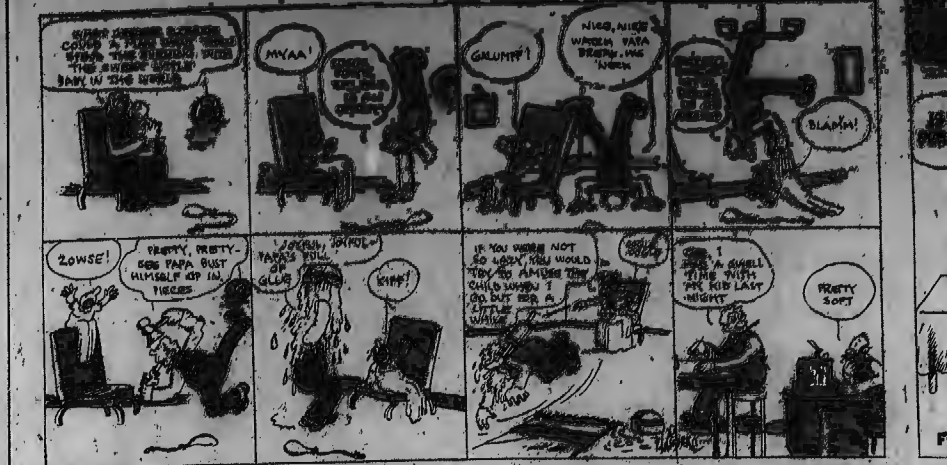

Four candidates were prepared to present their claims—Jules Joseph-Georges Curvier, former minister of the interior; Michel Oreste, a prominent senator; General Benoit-Léon, minister of war; and General Juvénal.
