Yoshihito Suffers From Inflammation of the Lungs and High Fever

(By Associated Press.) TOKYO, May 21.—Empress Teishin of Japan, who has been ill today, the physician in attendance declares that he is suffering from inflammation of the lungs. Emperor Yoshihito is in a state of high fever. Eight court physicians are in constant attendance on him. The emperor of Japan succeeded his father in July, 1911. He is his thirty-fourth year and has three sons. The emperor has previously suffered from lung ailments. During an attack in 1908 the condition was very serious. The emperor caught a slight cold in May, but it was considered to be unimportant and that the emperor would soon be well.

JAPS SAY AMERICA'S ANSWER TO PROTEST IS UNSATISFACTORY

Prospiration of War, Declares Adam Bede

(Special Dispatch to The Journal.) WASHINGTON, Ga. May 21.—There is little prospect of Japan going to war with the United States because of the differences that have arisen over the anti-labor law in California, said former Congressman Adam Bede, of Missouri, in Washington today. He is here on route to Manhattan to take part in a debate in that city with former Mayor Bede, a Socialist of Missouri. Mr. Bede is satisfied the United States will not hold back a fight to get rid of the Japanese agitator who is causing the California matter, and says the United States will whip the Japanese with ease. 'Japan is too poor to fight us, and there is not a nation anywhere that is as strong as we are,' he said, 'and if we do not declare the majority of our people will know it is in their interest to fight with us without any intention to our own country.'

Kansas City Negroes Try to Lynch One Of Their Own Color

(By Associated Press.) KANSAS CITY, Mo., May 21.—A mob of 500 negroes surrounded the Flora avenue police station in the negro quarters of Kansas City today, shouting for the death of a white policeman, one of their race, who last night confessed the slaying of a white woman. The mob, after a battle with the police, left with a batched last Saturday night. After a determined stand by the police, the negro was hustled through the mob to a motor car and carried to police headquarters.
