Episode Took Place in Office of Juvenile Protective Association, of Which He Is Secretary

Mr. Crawford Jackson, a former member of the North Georgia Methodist conference, now the secretary of the Georgia Juvenile Protective association, was bound over to the criminal court of Fulton county Saturday afternoon under a \$1000 bond on the charge of making improper advances toward a fourteen-year-old stenographer at the local office of the association.

The warrant against Mr. Jackson was issued by the father of the girl, with whom she has been boarder off on and on for the last five years.

It was known that at 3 o'clock Saturday afternoon, and shortly thereafter, Deputy Sheriff Rogers arrested Jackson in his office in the Third National bank building. A hearing was granted in Justice of the Peace C. H. O'Connell's court.

The hearing parties were represented by Attorney Frank Harrison and Mr. Jackson by George P. Whitman, of the law firm of Parker, Anderson, Dill and Whitman.

Both the complainant and the father bringing the charge were present.
