WHEN JUDGE ROAN DENYINGLY HELD RED HEADLINE IN FRONT OF JURY, DEFENSE MADE POINT

In His Address to the Jury, Judge Roan Declared That They Must Not Be Influenced by Anything They Had Read in the Newspaper, but Must Form Their Opinion Solely on the Evidence That Was Developed in Court

A red headline in a newspaper, held in the hands of the presiding judge, came over causing a mistrial Saturday noon in the case of Mary Phagan.

While the defense did not ask the court to declare a mistrial in the case, it was considered in a conference of attorneys, asking that the case be stopped and while apparently satisfied with an admission to the jury to disregard anything they might have seen in a paper, it is probable that the incident will be a part of the basis for an appeal, in event the verdict goes against the defense.

During the course of the discussion of the incident Solicitor Dorsey contended that the jurors had not seen the headline.
