Still Feeling Against Jew, Despite Democracy, Says Dr. Rosenau.

ROCHESTER, N. Y., Dec. 27. — The usual Sunday morning services of Berith Kodesh Temple were today incorporated as a part of the Jewish Chautauqua Convention. Dr. William Rosenau of Baltimore. Vice Chancellor of the Chautauqua, preached on "America: The Land of Milk and Honey."

"America has meant the emancipation of the Jew," said Dr. Rosenau. "He is free to follow his inclination here. It has set a standard for the redemption of the Jewish nation. There still remains room for improvement. Even with the great democracy that is enjoyed in America, occasionally there is and outbreak showing there is still feeling against the Hebrew. The Leo M. Frank trial in Atlanta is an example of this."
