Hearing of Her Daughter's Death, Mrs. G. W. Boyer Collapses Upon Reaching Hotel in Millen.

Savannah, Ga., August 20.—(Special.) Prostrate with grief because she was too late to reach her daughter's bedside before the end came, Mrs. G. W. Boyer, of Williamsport, Pa., mother of Mrs. Florence Boyer Godbee, who died last night at Millen from bullets fired by the divorced Mrs. Godbee, passed through Savannah today on her way to Millen.

"I want to see justice done," said Mrs. Boyer. "I have no vindictive feelings toward the first Mrs. Godbee, but I want the law to take its course. When asked whether or not she thought the first Mrs. Godbee insane, Mrs. Boyer appeared to resent the question, and replied sharply, 'No.' Mrs. Boyer's son, the brother of the slain woman, is expected to reach Millen tomorrow morning.

Mrs. Godbee, the slayer, still maintains her attitude of defiance, she still declines to make even the briefest statement about the case.

Her attorneys have advised to this effect, it is understood.

Laughs Over Tragedy.

Mrs. Godbee was arrested and jailed within thirty minutes after the tragedy. After the shooting she calmly walked by Judge Godbee's dead body and started toward home. After she had walked a short distance she was overtaken by Sheriff M. G. Johnson, who took her to jail. On the way to the jail she laughed about the shooting.

NEGRO SHOTS DOWN HIS WHITE CAPTOR AND MAKES ESCAPE

Greenville, Ga., August 20.—J. C. Marchman, a farmer, was shot and instantly killed near here late today by Walter Brewster, a negro, whom Marchman was bringing to Greenville for trial on a criminal charge. Brewster jumped from Marchman's buggy, rushed into a negro's house by the roadside and secured a shotgun. He chased Marchman around the house for several minutes, finally killing him. Sheriff Jarrell and a posse, with bloodhounds, are searching for Brewster tonight.

DELAY IN SIGNING BILL DISQUALIFIES VOTERS

Macon, Ga., August 20.—(Special.)—The inability of Governor Slaton to sign the bill annexing Cherokee Heights to the city of Macon before today makes it impossible for the residents of that section of the city to vote in the coming municipal primary. The signing of the bill three days earlier would have made this possible. The law is that people must reside in the city three months before being qualified to vote. The election will be held on November 13, just 27 days from today.

In Favor of McDonald.

Washington, August 20.—The house elections committee today agreed unanimously to report in favor of seating William J. McDonald, progressive for the twelfth Michigan district. Hugh Young, republican, resigned the seat because he believed McDonald had been beaten on a technicality.

ink. She said she had to kill both, but wanted to kill Mrs. Florence Godbee first. She was shot three times in the back, one ball going through the right lung, one lodging in the left lung and the third piercing the lower stomach through a hip.

Back of this tragedy is a long list of marital troubles ending in Mrs. Edna Godbee suing Judge Godbee for divorce. He was wealthy, and in her suit she asked for a large sum as alimony. She refused her divorce, but lost the alimony, and was bitterly disappointed. This was about five years ago.

Married Third Time. Early this year Judge Godbee married Miss Florence Boyer of Williamsport, Pa. This was his third marriage. His first wife died years ago. The last marriage was another bitter disappointment to Mrs. Edna Godbee. She lived at her home here with her daughter, Miss Sarah Godbee, 18 years old. There are two other children—Frank Godbee, of Swainsboro, and King Godbee, of Augusta.

Funeral at Waynesboro. Millen, Ga., August 20.—(Special.)—Mrs. G. W. Boyer, mother of Mrs. W. S. Godbee, arrived in Millen this morning. She received information on route of the death of her daughter, suffered a complete collapse, and is now quite ill at a local hotel, requiring the services of a trained nurse. The brother of Mrs. Godbee is expected tomorrow.

Funeral services will take place at Waynesboro Friday morning, and the remains will be interred there by the side of Mr. Godbee.

Mrs. Edna Godbee is holding up remarkably well in the Jenkins county jail. She has made no statement yet.

GEORGE M'TEER FOUND DEAD IN HIS ROOM

Shortly after having ordered a soft drink yesterday afternoon at 2:15 o'clock, George E. McTeer, a popular salesman connected with the Keely company, was found dead in his room in the Hight apartments at 167 Whitehall.

Mr. McTeer had complained of feeling ill when at the store Wednesday, and went home rather early. It is said, at 5:30 o'clock in the afternoon he asked a little negro girl to get him a milk shake. When the girl returned he was apparently sleeping, and when Frank Crump, in whose apartment Mr. McTeer was staying, entered the room he was found dead.

The body was taken to Bloemfield's parlors, where the inquest will be held this morning at 9:30 o'clock.

Mr. McTeer is survived by his mother and two sisters in Greenville, S. C.

Institutes Discontinued Through Lack of Funds Athens, Ga., August 20.—(Special.)—There will be no farmers' institutes conducted from the state college of agriculture next year. This year's institutes, going out on three routes simultaneously, have reached to date more than forty thousand adult farmers who attended the sessions and took part in the work. In only one county was there a failure of the institute for lack of a crowd—and there the meeting was not advertised locally through an oversight in some way. No appropriation was made for the institute by the legislature, though at the last every other item originally provided in the appropriations bill was passed. Just \$2,000 was appropriated last year. Not a penny this year was set aside for this purpose, and the institutes, according to the statement from the college, will be discontinued next summer. New High School for Royston. Royston, Ga., August 20.—(Special.)—Plans are being drawn for Royston's new high school building and the contract is to be let at once for the erection at a cost of about \$20,000, with all modern conveniences. The school, as usual, will open on September 1st in temporary quarters until the new building is completed.

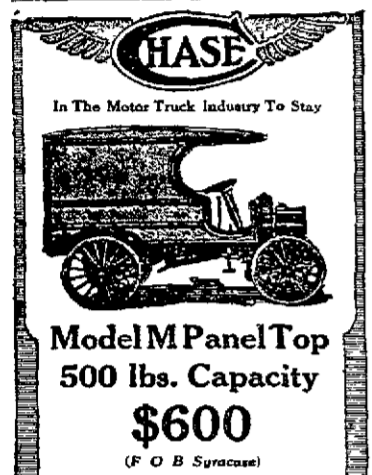

# INDUSTRIAL BUREAU TO ISSUE BULLETIN

## First Pamphlet Will Contain a Copy of Georgia's "Blue Sky" Law

Bulletin No. 1 of the Atlanta Industrial and Statistical Bureau containing a copy of the blue sky law which was passed at the recent session of the legislature will be mailed to bankers, merchants, professional and business men throughout the state and others who may wish a copy.

This is the first of a series of bulletins which will be prepared under the direction of W. H. Leahy, head of the bureau which will deal with all matters pertaining to the industrial and commercial life of Georgia and the state at large.

Officials of the local chamber consider it particularly appropriate that the first bulletin should deal with the blue sky law which the chamber of commerce together with Representatives Spence of Carroll and Wohlwend of Muscogee were instrumental in passing.

Motorcycle Racer Succumbs to Injuries Without Regaining Consciousness—Funeral and Interment Today
