

BANDIT CAPTURED WHO SENT 51 SOULS TO A FLAMING DEATH

Maximo Castillo, the Mexican Responsible for the Tunnel Horror, Is Made Prisoner by U. S. Soldiers. SIX OF HIS FOLLOWERS TAKEN WITH CASTILLO

Bandit and His Men Will Probably Be Returned to Mexico and General Villa Will Put Them to Death.

El Paso, Texas, February 17.—Maximo Castillo, the Mexican bandit charged with responsibility for the Cumbre tunnel disaster in which ten Americans and forty-one others lost their lives, was captured thirty-eight miles south of Hachita, N. M., today by American troops.

Information was conveyed today to General Hugh L. Scott, commandant at Fort Bliss, in an official telegram from Captain White, ninth United States cavalry.

Six Followers With Bandit. With the bandit were six of his followers, who, according to Captain White, were captured without a fight. They will be brought here.

Castillo, to avoid a range of mountains on the Mexican side, made a detour which brought him into American territory. Captain White was on the watch, having received information yesterday from Walter McCormick, American manager of Las Pallas ranch, on the Mexican side, that the much-wanted man was in the vicinity.

Tunnel Still Burning.

Castillo set fire to a freight train in the Cumbre tunnel two weeks ago. The cars were burning when a passenger train crashed into it, and every life aboard was lost. The tunnel still is burning.

To Be Returned to Mexico.

Washington, February 17.—Consideration has been given by officials here to the question of what should be done with the bandit leader Castillo and his followers in the event of their capture on American soil. As a result of the disaster occurred in Mexico, no crime can be charged against the bandits in the United States and tonight would result in their immediate capture and return to Mexico.

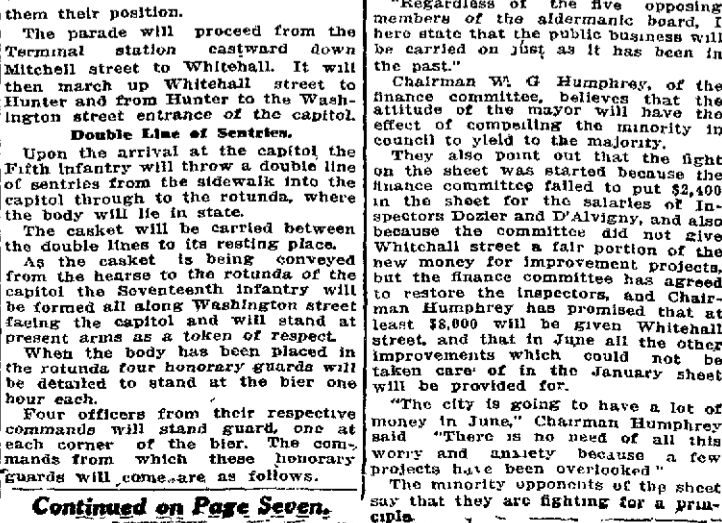
President Denies Emphatically That His Correspondence Is Handled With Religious Prejudice.

Washington, February 17.—In a letter to W. W. Prescott, editor of The Protestant Magazine published here, President Wilson has denied emphatically that his correspondence is handled with religious prejudice by his secretary, Joseph Tumulty.

The correspondence made public today by the magazine follows: "The President, Washington, D. C., January 15, 1914. 'Sir, I learn from personal interviews and correspondence that there is a wide-spread feeling among Protestants that it is practically impossible for any communication relating to religious activities of the Roman Catholic church to reach you personally, for thereupon all such letters are withheld from you by your private secretary, Mr. Tumulty. It is unfortunate, both for you and for the country that such an impression prevails, and that it seems to have some foundation.

Leo M. Frank, denied by the supreme court a new trial for the murder of Mary Phagan, now faces one of three final recourses. First, motion for a re-hearing before the court which handed down yesterday's decision.

Second, an extraordinary motion for new trial before the superior court in which he was originally arraigned, on a basis of newly found evidence. Third, an appeal to the supreme court of the United States on the grounds that he was technically deprived of constitutional rights during his first trial.

He can invoke all three in which event, it is not likely the case will finally end within less than a year's time. The defense is seeking to extract the weaknesses of the affirmative opinion and the strength of the dissenting one to present both in a new fight for a new trial which is to be waged in either the same supreme court in which the sustaining verdict was handed down or in the federal supreme court, America's ultimate tribunal.

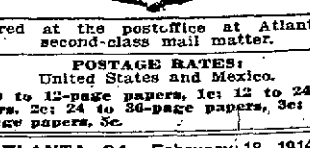
