WOMEN ARE DENIED PLACES ON BOARDS BY COUNCIL ACTION

In His Veto, Which Was Sustained, Woodward Stated Law Would Make Commissions Unwieldy.

Council Overrides Mayor's Veto of Resolution Giving It Permission to Break Board Deadlocks.

Atlanta women who desire to participate politically in the administrathe city's affairs saw their hopes blasted yesterday when the general council sustained Mayor Jame) G. Woodward's veto of the proposed char-

Woodward's veto of the proposed chalter amendment admitting women as members of foun chartered boards. In his message to council Mayor Woodward took the position that by adding five more members to the educational, park, library and hospital boards, making the membership seventeen instead of twelve, these bodies would be made too unwieldy and less useful, and he pointed to his attitude in the recent charter fight as a pracedent for his action.

When the mayor's message was read before council it was voted to appoint a committee of five to discuss the vetoes ; seven in number, among which the suffrage amendment. Three was the suffrage amendment. Three members of the committee voted on report sustaining the mayor. They ook the position that while women should be allowed on boards, still they should be allowed on boards, still they should not be added along with the twelve now provided by the charter, but should be made eligible to take the places of retiring members. The other members of the committee thought that women should be made eligible to take places on the board and serve whenever elected.

When the veto was finally offered to council for vote it was sustained by a vote of 17 against 10.

GAS INVESTIGATION

Petition Filed With Coun-With View to Securing a Cheaper Rate.

The Gas Consumers' league, through City Electrician R. C. Turner, yesterday filed with council a petition signed by 5,000 registered voters urging the city to appropriate \$5,000 for the use of the Georgia Railroad commission to make an investigation into the affairs of the Atlanta Gas Light company.

The petition is the first filed invoking the initiative and referendum granted under the charter amendments which were passed up by the legislature last year.

The petition also marks the first step in the direction of forcing the Atlanta Gas Light company to reducits rate from \$1 to 80 cents.

The resolution accompanying the petition was referred to the finance committee because it will be up to the committee to find the money to be used in making the investigation. The question will then be submitted to the voters at an election to be held probably in August to determine whether or not the investigation shall be made.

The committee on fire prevention of the National Board of Fire Underwriters, which has just rendered its complete report on the city of Atlanta, recommends many important changes and improvements in the city's fire pro-

tection system.

The report criticises Atlanta's fire-fighting facilities at many points. It cites that the pumping capacity is inadequate, and that while pressures generally are well maintained, they are only fair in the congested valve dis-

The report gives Chief W. B. Cum-The report gives Chief W. B. Cummings a clean bill of health as a capable fire chief. The department, however, says the report is slightly undermanned and supervision is not wholly satisfactory. Additional companies are needed in the outlying districts. The chemical service is declared deficient. One-third of the hose supply is found to be in questionable condition. The fire methods and the manner in which records are kept was found by the

Financial Support Needed.

Important Recommendations

Reported That They Are Secret Passengers on the Steamer Ypiranga Which Sailed From Vera Cruz Monday.

Vera Cruz, June 1.—Coincident with the salling of the Hamburg-American steamer Ypiranga from here late today, persistent rumors, originating fr Mexico City and brought here by refu-gees, were circulated that Senor Huerta and her four sons were aboard the ship. The Ppiranga cleared for Europe by way of Havana. As she left the harbor the German cruiser Dresden unexpectedly hauled up her auchoir and followed at sea. There was a report that the liner's destination

There is no means to verify the report or to get a positive denial.

El Paso, Texas, June 1.—A semi-official statement from General Car-ranza's headquarters at Durango, criti-cising the action of the A. E. C. modiators at Niagara Falls, and an announce-ment from General Villa reiterating his allegiance as a military leader to Carranza, were the developments today of the Mexican situation here. 



Measure Authorizing Federal Grants to States Before Congress-States Must Act to Secure the Appro-

Washington, June 1 — National grants to the states for vocational education age recommended in the report of the commission on national aid to vocational education, which was submitted to congress today. A bill authorizing these grants was introduced in the senate today by Senator Hoke Smith, Georgia, chairman of the commission, and in the house by Representative Dudley. M. Hughes, of Georgia.

Seven million dollars, as a maximum annual appropriation for this purpose, is advocated by the commission. This amount is to be reached by a graduated scale in the year 1924 and is to be made annually thereafter. It is provided that in the year 1915, \$1,500-000 be appropriated and that each year thereafter a stipulated increase made until the maximum is attained. This money is to be expended under careful federal supervision for the salaries of teachers, supervisors, directors of agricultural subjects and of teachers of trade and industrial subjects, and for the training of teachers of vocational subjects.
