



## First Marmon Ever Built





Pitasburg. March 28.—Daniel Willard, president of the Baltimore and Ohio railroad and chalrman of the presidents' committee of railroads in official classification territory, at the annual dinner of the traffic club of Pitasburg argued for higher freight rates, and John Barrett, director general of the Pan-American union, sounded a note of warning in connection with the Panama canal. Present at the dinner were many railroad executives from New York, Chicago and other transporation centers.

"It gradually has come about that, under existing conditions, rates in effect in official classification territory do not yield sufficient revenues to meet the situation properly." said Mr. Will-

"It has been stated that the growin "It has been stated that the growing need of the country's commerce will require an additional expenditure by the rallroads for equipment and facilities of upwards of a billion dollars a year for some years. The only way in which such money can be obtained is through private enterprise, and railroad investment must be made sufficiently attractive to secure new capital, else development will cease. Nothing can more effectually check the growth of commerce than insufficient transportation facilities.

"I do not think the necessity for increased facilities on the part of the carriers in official classification territory is seriously questioned by anyone at this time."



Do not wait until the legislature meets to work for the passage of the which you are interested, and depend upon hastily organized com mittees sent to the lobby at the last minute to press the passage of a beg the federated club women of Georgia!

There are many bills in which the women of Georgia are justly interested. Among these the public health bill, generally known as the "Ellis bill;" the always "existing" and "pending," "tabled," and "put-off" bill, entitled, "Compulsory Education;" the age of consent bill; a bill pertaining to the better regulation of child labor; a bill to provide a law requiring registration of rital statistics; a bill to provide hospital facilities in state educational institutions, and other bills of kindred importance.

Too often women, pressed to use their influence in these matters, wait until the representatives in the different counties have left for Atlanta, and bsorbed by the complexities and distractions of the legislative body Who is to be the next governor, or next senator, becomes the paramount issue too often, and men in their intensity of interest in one man pitted against another for an office, or one faction word-dueling with another the press, and through the corridors of the statehouse, and the smoky atmosphere of cases, forget to read even the letters sent them by their constituents, and are very much bored by committees waiting upor them outside the door of the senate or house.

rganization urge upon you. Do not merely scan them, but read them carefully. Then find out the names of your representatives, and see them personally or communicate with them by letter. If they are opposed to the bill, find out why they are; get their arguments against the bill and see if they are well founded. Equip yourself to meet their arguments, and then get others to work with you for what you wish.
