Parent Near Prostration. Both Mr. and Mrs. Tribble are on the verge of nervous prostration from loss of sleep and worry over the condition of their child. The little girl has no control over her left side, and the little left arm lies constantly lifeless on the covers. Her right eye is useless. The eyeballs are protruding from beneath her opened lids, and her mother said she had seen the muscles of the right eye for two weeks.

The little child can say but one word. When she awakes she comes from school on the last day of school, after winning plaids by her sweetness and beauty in the closing exercises, she staggered into the house in a stupor. Mrs. Tribble asked her what was the matter, and the child sank into a chair. She tried to get up, but the words would not come. The mother took her in her arms, and the little arms closed tightly about her neck. The little eyes strained and gazed into the face of the mother, and the little lips after long struggles uttered three words: "Mamma, my head!" Then she fainted, and fell into convulsions within a few hours.

Since then the child has spoken only the word "Mamma."
