### CANDLER IS NOT SATISFIED

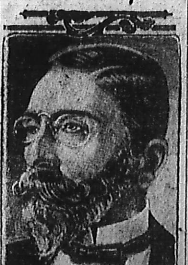
#### Chairman of Probers Says He Intends to Reconsider Thoroughly All Evidence.

The committee will meet Saturday to frame its formal report to Council.

It is time to recall Browning's beautiful words: "God's in His heaven, all's well with the world."
