

LEO FRANK'S MOTHER BURIED

Reference to Great Tragedy of Her
Life at Simple Funeral Services.

Mrs. Ray Frank was buried yesterday in Mount Carmel Cemetery, Cypress Hills. She died on New Year's Day in the Hotel St. George, Brooklyn, confident of the innocence of her son, Leo, who was lynched in 1915 after having been taken from the Georgia State Penitentiary, where he was serving a life sentence, as commutation of the death penalty, for the murder of Mary Phagan.

Funeral services were held at the home of Mrs. Marion Stern, Mrs. Frank's daughter, at 152 Underhill Avenue. Rabbi Alexander Lyons of the Eighth Avenue Temple officiated at the simple services. He alluded to Mrs. Frank's tragedy-strewn life, and referred to her son's death as an incident which hastened her end, despite her abiding conviction of his guiltlessness.
